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The institution strives to create a favourable atmosphere for the academic growth of its students and faculty and is well-equipped with various types of learning spaces to suit different pedagogical needs.

I. **Classrooms and lecture theatres:** It has spacious and comfortable classrooms that are ideal for conducting lectures, seminars, workshops and tutorials, where students can interact with the instructors and peers.

There are lecture theatres on the premises that can accommodate up to 80 students, equipped with state-of-the-art audio-visual systems and interactive features. These are suitable for delivering large-scale presentations, demonstrations, regular classes and guest lectures, where the students can engage with the teachers/speakers and the content.

II. **ICT Enabled Classrooms:** The college has 12 ICT Enabled classrooms which are designed to facilitate collaborative and active learning, with podiums and Wi-Fi connectivity. These classrooms are perfect for conducting group projects, case studies, etc. where students can work together and use technology to enhance their learning outcomes.

III. **Laboratories:** It also has 13 state-of-the-art laboratories for various disciplines, such as Computer Science (03), Geography (02),

Defence and Strategic Studies (01), Functional English (01) Environment Conservation (01), Psychology (01), Business Administration (01), Fine Arts (01) and Music vocal (01) and Music Instrumental (01) where students can conduct experiments and other related work under the guidance of qualified instructors, who have expertise and experience in their respective fields. Two out of the labs mentioned above are dedicated solely as learning spaces for music students with a variety of musical instruments like sitar, guitar, rawab, harmonium, etc.

**IV. Library:** The college library provides access to a variety of resources for its members and visitors. It contains books, journals, databases, and multimedia materials on various topics and boasts of a collection of 48229 books and 6000 e-journals, 199500 e-books, etc. The fully air-conditioned library is a valuable asset for the institution and its community, as it supports learning and teaching.

**V. Multimedia Hall:** The Institution has an air-conditioned multimedia hall that is equipped with state-of-the-art technology and facilities. The hall can accommodate up to 200 people and can be used for various purposes, such as lectures, seminars, workshops, presentations, screenings, and performances. The hall has a large screen, a projector, a sound system, a podium, and a wireless microphone along with internet access.

**VI. Seminar Room:** The Institution offers an air-conditioned seminar room that can accommodate up to 60 people for various events and activities. The room is equipped with a projector, a sound system, a digital podium and a whiteboard. The room can be arranged in a semi-circular layout, allowing for a better view of the presenter and the screen. The Institution aims to provide a conducive and comfortable environment for learning and sharing.

**VII. Auditorium:** One of the facilities the Institution offers to its members and visitors is a spacious and modern fully air-conditioned auditorium with a seating capacity of 800 comfortable chairs and ample legroom. The auditorium is suitable for hosting various events, such as lectures, seminars, workshops, conferences, and performances. The auditorium has a stage, a podium, a backstage area, dressing rooms for the speakers or performers and washrooms for the performers and the audience.

VIII. **UGC Network Resource Centre:** Set up during the UGC Xth Plan period, this Centre has 14 computers, 03 printers and a free browsing facility for students from 09.30 AM to 04.00 PM.

IX. **Sports facilities:** The Institution provides sports facilities too. These include indoor and outdoor gyms, a basketball court, and a playfield that has standard dimensions and markings with an area measuring approximately 18205 sq. metres to host friendly matches and tournaments. The sports arena allows the students and staff to engage in physical activities, improve their health and fitness, and develop their teamwork and leadership skills.

The institution also offers a spacious and well-equipped yoga hall for the students and staff. The yoga hall is designed to provide a serene and comfortable environment for practising various forms of yoga asanas, meditation and relaxation. The details are as follows:

Furthermore, an electronic visual display screen to present electronically transmitted notices, information, images, etc. was set up in front of the administrative block in 2019-20 and the construction of an IT block and hostel accommodation for boys and girls started on the college campus during the session 2022-23.
