NSS AT A GLANCE

The overall aim of National Service Scheme as envisaged earlier, is to give an extension dimension to the higher education system and orient the student youth to community service while they are studying in educational institutions. The reason for the formulation of this objective is the general realization that the students in the +2 level and above have a tendency to get alienated from the village/slum masses that constitute the majority of the population of the country. The educated youth who are expected to take the reins of administration in future are found to be unaware of the problems of the community and in certain cases are indifferent towards their needs and problems. Therefore it is necessary to arouse the social conscience of the students, and to provide them an opportunity to work with the people in the villages and slums. It is felt that their interaction with the common villagers and slum- dwellers will

expose them to the realities of life, and bring about a change in their social perception.

Aim of NSS Activities: Awareness on Environmental Protection:

In present scenario environmental damages is causing loss to the national economy in billions in the form of deforestation and soil erosion only. On the other hand water air and noise pollution are causing havoc to the health of the nationals. In spite of govt. policies and number of laws, nothing concrete has been done at the individual level to fight the environmental pollution. The role of N.S.S. becomes very important in this context as constitution of India also envisages that it is fundamental duty of every citizen to protect and improve the natural environment [Art. 51A (g)]. NSS activities will create awareness on protection of environment.

Health Awareness Programme: Progress and development of a nation depends upon the health of its nationals. Every year thousands of mothers and infants die due to lack of post natal care facilities. Even during pregnancy women are not provided with healthy and nutritious food. Overall general health of Indian nationals is very-very poor as they cannot afford even the minimum calorie intake required. The aim of NSS is to provide necessary basic information and awareness on health related concepts.

Literacy Programme: The constitutions of India provides for the right to education (Article 21), the right to free and compulsory education to all children upto 14 years is also now guaranteed as a fundamental right under Art. 21 A of the

constitution (constitution 86th Amendment Act, 2001). But without making right to education a reality the fundamental rights guaranteed under the constitution shall remain beyond the reach of large majority which is illiterate. N.S.S. volunteers are required to take up number of activities for the eradication of illiteracy such as adult education, non formal education, and women literacy programmes etc. **Community Development:** Other intervention areas for the N.S.S. activities are sustainable development, rural reconstruction, watershed management and wasteland development. N.S.S. volunteers are required to take steps to develop community assets infrastructure and preserve natural resources of the country.

Student Development: The motto of NSS is to develop the community by educating the society along with that student personal development. One of the objectives of NSS is uphold personal growth of students through involvement in community development. Objectives: The broad objectives of NSS are to:

- Understand the community in which the volunteers work.
- Understand themselves in relation to their community
- Identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in problem solving processes
- Develop in them a sense of social and civic responsibility
- Utilize their knowledge in finding practical solution to individual and community problems
- Develop competence required for group-living and sharing of

responsibilities Gain skills in mobilizing community participation, Acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude, Develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters and Practice national integration and social harmony.

The Motto

The motto or watchword of the National Service Scheme is 'NOT ME BUT YOU'. This reflects the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for selfless service and appreciation of the other person's point of view, and also to show consideration for fellow human beings. It underlines the fact that the welfare of an individual is ultimately dependent on the welfare of society as the whole. Therefore, it should be the aim of the NSS to demonstrate this motto in its day-to-day activities.



NATIONAL CADETS CORPS

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NATIONAL CADETS CORPS (NAVAL WING)

National Cadet Corps (NCC), Naval wing is engaged in grooming the youth of the college into disciplined and patriotic citizens. "Unity and Discipline" as the motto, NCC aims at developing discipline, character, brotherhood, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young students. It also aims to enlighten leadership qualities among the youth who will serve the Nation regardless of which career they choose. It also motivates the young to choose a career in armed forces. There are total 50 Seats

1) Institutional training - conducted at Colleges is the mainstay of NCC training and is conducted by Associate NCC Officer and PI staff of 1-Chd Naval Unit NCC, Chandigarh. The syllabus the ratio 70:30. While the Senior Wing/Division training is for three years and has 300 periods the Junior Wing/Division training is for two years and encompasses 240 periods of training. The training year is from 01 Apr to 31 March. Training schedules planned for cadets ensure that the optimum benefits of the organisation reach maximum number of cadets. Emphasis is on practical training.

Institutional training includes basic military training to the cadets as part of the curriculum and prepares them to join the Armed Forces. It is conducted with the following specific purpose:-

First, to expose young cadets to a 'regimental way of life' which is essential to inculcate in them the values of discipline, duty, punctuality, orderliness, smartness, respect for the authorities, correct work ethos, and self- confidence.

Second, to generate interest in cadets by including and laying emphasis on those aspects of Institutional Training which attract young cadets into the NCC and provides them an element of thrill and excitement.

Thirdly, to inculcate Defence Services work ethos that is characterised by hard work, sincerity of purpose, honesty, ideal of selfless service, dignity of labour, secular outlook, comradeship, spirit of adventure and sportsmanship.

2) Camp training – Camp training is the practical manifestation of institutional training. The basic aim of Camps is to introduce cadets to a regimented way of life and to help in developing camaraderie, team work, leadership qualities, self-confidence, self-reliance and dignity of labour in the cadets. The cadets are exposed to the excitement of camp life where they apply the theoretical knowledge that they acquired in Institutional Training. It is mandatory for Senior Division/ Senior Wing cadets to attend a minimum of two camps during the period of their enrolment. The various types of camps conducted by the NCC are as follows:-

Annual Training Camps/ Combined Annual Training Camps (ATC/CATC), Leadership Camps, National Integration Camps (NIC)/ Special National Integration Camps (SNIC). National Integration Camps (NIC) and Special National Integration Camps are conducted to make cadets understand and value the rich heritage of cultures that forge unity despite the diverse languages, traditions and religions of our country. NIC are conducted on an all India basis and help bridge the cultural gap among various states of India.

3) Nau Sainik Camp – This camp is conducted annually for Naval Wing Cadets. Boat pulling regatta and sailing competitions are the main activities of this camp.

4) The Annual Republic Day Camp (RDC) – The Annual Republic Day Camp (RDC) is held at Garrison Parade Ground, Delhi Cantt every year from 01 Jan to 29 Jan. It is a matter of great pride for a cadet to be selected to represent his/her state in the Republic Day Camp. The Prime Minister's Rally, the most prestigious event of the NCC Republic Day Camp is held on 28 January every year. The PM's Rally commences with the Guard of Honour presented to Hon'ble Prime Minister by NCC Cadets.

Social Service activities are structured to inspire and encourage the cadets to participate voluntarily towards improvement of their physical and social environment and channelize their energies in the task of nation building. The social service and community development activities include Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Tree Plantation, Anti-Drug Rally, Cancer Awareness, Disaster Relief, Blood Donation, Beti Bachao Beti Padhao, AIDS Awareness, Care for the Blind, Traffic Control and other

similar relevant contemporary social issues. Selected NCC cadets participate in Youth Exchange Programme which is a country to country exchange of cadets belonging to NCC/equivalent Govt/ youth organizations of friendly countries.

Adventure is the life blood of youth. Adventure training in the NCC provides knowledge to cadets of the topography as well as experience of different weather conditions and adventurous living under camp conditions. NCC cadets are given the opportunity to participate in adventure activities like Mountain Treks and Expeditions, Trekking, Parasailing, Sailing, Scuba Diving, Kayaking, etc.

Naval Wing of NCC facilitates access to high potential sports like Sailing & Shooting to talented cadets so as to sharpen their team and sports skills.

Certification

On successful completion of the their training, cadets of Senior Division/Wing are eligible for 'B' & 'C' certificate examinations. These are open for the cadets who have attended requisite number of periods and camps during their training.

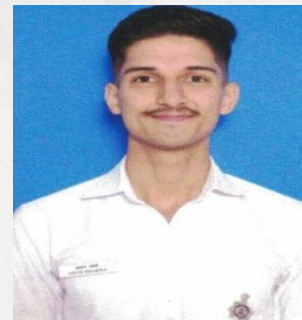

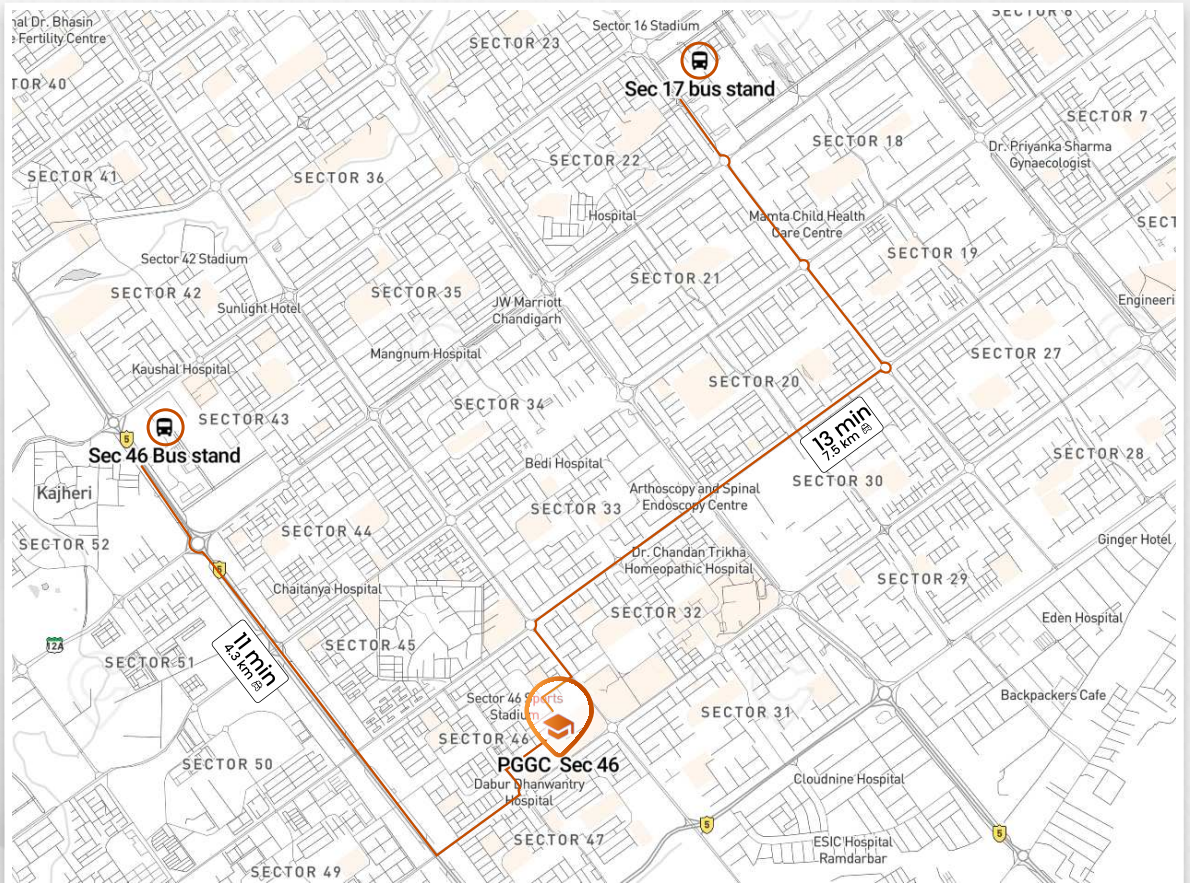
