The reason for the formulation of this objective is the general realization that the students in the +2 level and above have a tendency to get alienated from the village/slum masses that constitute the majority of the population of the country. The educated youth who are expected to take the reins of administration in the future are found to be unaware of the problems of the community and in certain cases are indifferent toward their needs and problems. Therefore, it is necessary to arouse the student's social conscience and to provide them with an opportunity to work with the people in the villages and slums.
