INSTITUTIONAL PROFILE

AN OVERVIEW

Nestled in the south of the City Beautiful, Post Graduate Government College, Sector-46, Chandigarh, is a leading multidisciplinary institution of higher learning. Though it is just over four decades old, it has made rapid strides in academic excellence, both qualitatively and quantitatively. Evaluated by NAAC for Cycle-III accreditation in May 2024, the institute received a Grade 'B+' and a CGPA of 2.72, and prepares students to succeed as educators, leaders, and engaged citizens in an increasingly complex and diverse society.



BRIEF HISTORY

The government established the college as a boys' college affiliated with Panjab University, and it began operations on July 13, 1982. At the outset, it was housed in a

building at the Government School, Sector 40, Chandigarh, and was moved to its present spacious, sprawling 16.02-acre, eco-friendly campus in 1989. The then Governor, Sh. S.S. Ray laid the foundation stone of the building. and the college transitioned into a co-educational institute in 1992. At first, the College offered basic courses in BA (Humanities) and BCom. However, it added new courses and streams over the years and made notable progress. A UGC-sponsored vocational course in Advertising and Sales Promotion was added in 1997, followed by BBA in 2017; BCA and MCom in 1999 and 2000, respectively. Adding new dimensions to the college profile, environment conservation was added as an undergraduate course of study in 2019.

This multi-faculty institution aims to provide inclusive education that inculcates human values, professionalism and a scientific temper, and to establish a community of scholars actively pursuing the acquisition, creation, and dissemination of knowledge. 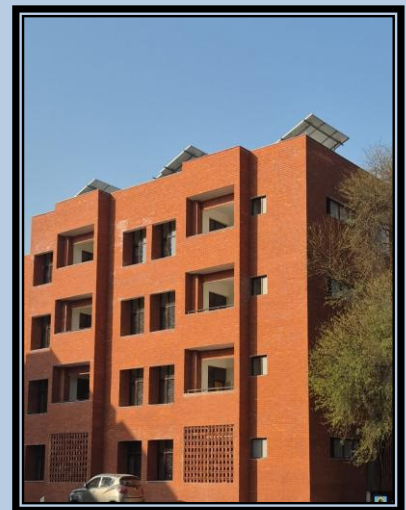

DIVING INTO COLLEGE CULTURE: A SNAPSHOT OF STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

Complementing formal education, these activities help students develop essential soft skills, such as leadership, teamwork, and communication. Participation in these activities also broadens horizons beyond the classroom, providing practical experiences that are pivotal to personal development and career readiness. Such opportunities

collectively create a dynamic educational ecosystem where students can thrive both academically and personally, ultimately preparing them for successful futures in their chosen fields.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The National Service Scheme (NSS), a community service programme, engages students in constructive social action and involves them in the life of the wider community. The college has four NSS units, and the volunteers contributed their services to all the events organised at the college, working tirelessly for the community. The details of the activities carried out throughout the session are as follows:

- An orientation program was held on September 18, 2025, to welcome new National Service Scheme (NSS) volunteers at a college. The event aimed to introduce the NSS's vision, mission, and activities, featuring Dr Nemi Chand, the State Liaison Officer, as the Guest Speaker. The Dean and Vice Principal also attended alongside enthusiastic faculty and student participants. Dr Satyajeet, NSS Incharge, welcomed attendees and highlighted upcoming donation camps, awareness drives, and community outreach programs for the year. Dr Nemi Chand emphasised the importance of socially responsible youth and the NSS motto, "Not Me, But You," encouraging students to pursue leadership, teamwork, and service in their education. An important highlight of the program was an engaging session on the My Bharat Initiative, delivered by Dr Amanpreet Kaur. She explained how this government-led digital platform connects youth with internship, volunteering, and skill-development opportunities. Dr Amanpreet Kaur also encouraged NSS volunteers to register on the portal, participate actively in national initiatives, and inspire others to use the platform to support their holistic growth.
- The NSS Unit and the Department of Defence and Strategic Studies celebrated National Space Day on August 23, 2025, focusing on the theme "Innovation for India's Better Future Space Program." The event highlighted India's advancements in space technology and aimed to inspire student contributions to space research. A poster-making competition with participants from diverse fields showcased innovative ideas about India's space missions and future concepts. Faculty commended participants for

their creativity, emphasising India's space achievements as symbols of self-reliance and scientific progress. Winners received certificates, and all participants were acknowledged, reflecting the college's dedication to creativity and innovation.

- A lecture on 'Alcoholism and Alcoholics Anonymous' was organised on September 11, 2025, to educate students on the dangers of alcoholism and promote addiction-free lifestyles. Collaborating with Alcoholics Anonymous (AA), the session featured AA members who shared their recovery stories, providing inspiration and knowledge to the audience. The Principal of the college Prof. Dr Beenu Dogra praised the initiative and recognised the AA contributors. The workshop emphasised that alcoholism is a disease affecting health, relationships and career, requiring awareness and community support for recovery. Students were encouraged to spread the message of de-addiction and build an addiction-free community. The session ended with students pledging to avoid addiction, underlining the message "Say No to Alcohol, Say Yes to Life."



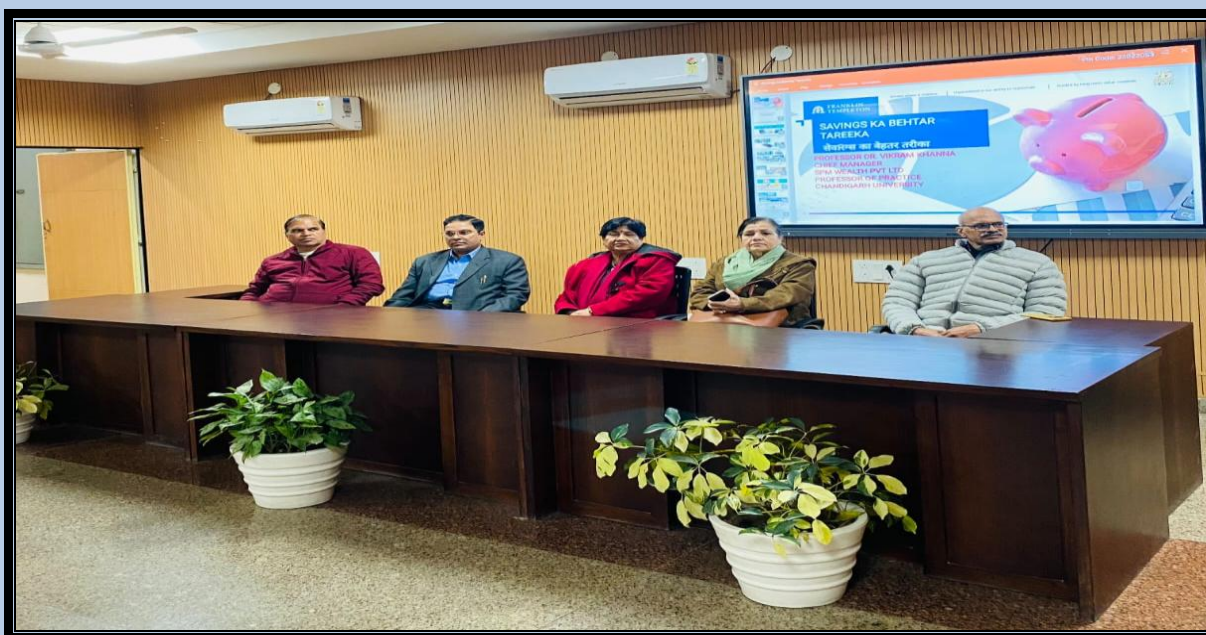
- On September 24, 2025, the NSS Day Celebration aptly embodied its commitment to environmental stewardship through a dedicated tree plantation drive. Coinciding with the National Service Scheme's objective of fostering social welfare and community engagement, this initiative marked a collaborative effort among volunteers, students, and local authorities. Emphasising sustainability and biodiversity conservation, the event aimed to address pressing ecological concerns by enhancing green cover in urban areas. Participants meticulously planted indigenous saplings across designated zones, supplemented by a briefing on sustainable horticultural practices. This initiative aligns with global reforestation goals and reflects an acute awareness of climate change challenges. By intertwining action with education, the celebration not only honoured

NSS's founding principles but also empowered participants with practical skills to have a lasting ecological impact. The symbolic act of planting trees reinforced the collective responsibility towards nurturing resilient ecosystems for future generations.

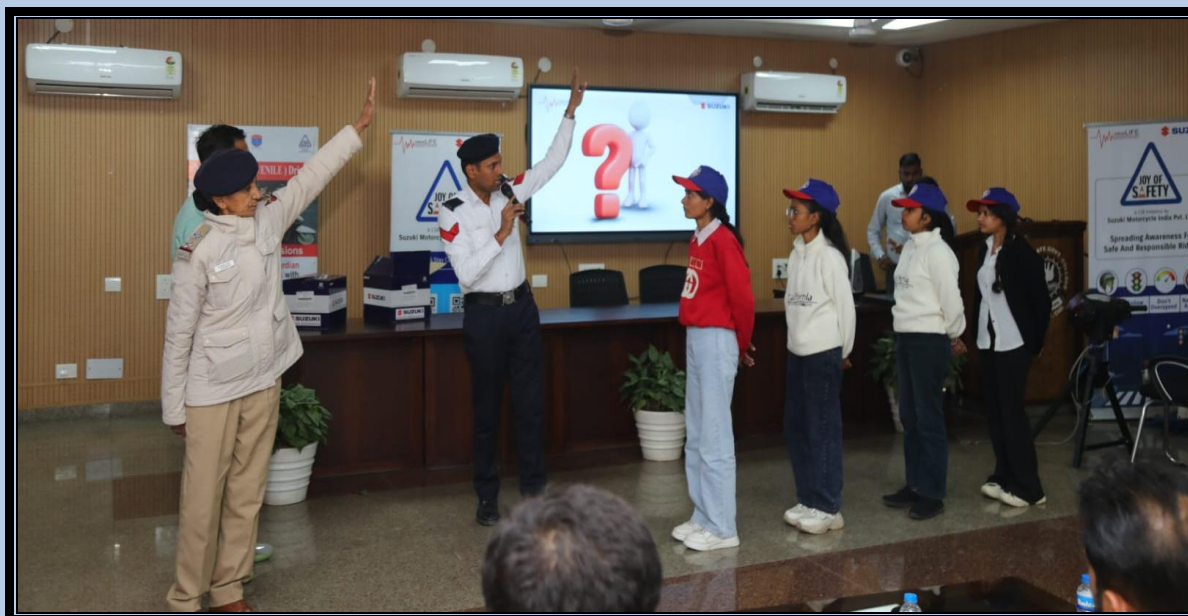
- On October 31, 2025, volunteers of the National Service Scheme (NSS), students and staff participated in a solemn and unified expression of national solidarity by taking the National Unity Day pledge. This initiative served both to commemorate the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, India's first Deputy Prime Minister and key architect in post-independence state integration, and to reinforce foundational values integral to India's socio-political framework. Through this collective action, NSS volunteers reiterated their commitment to fostering unity across diverse communities and to upholding national integrity. The ritual reinforced principles of inclusivity, collaboration, and resilience amid the varied social and cultural landscapes that characterize the nation's demographic tapestry. Such pledges are pivotal in encouraging broader participation in civic duties among the youth—who play an instrumental role in shaping India's future—and echo Sardar Patel's vision for a cohesive and prosperous nation.
- The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit celebrated the 150th anniversary of the song "Vande Mataram," written by Bankim Chandra Chatterjee in 1875. Volunteers gathered and sang the song, highlighting its significance and patriotic value. Principal Prof. Binu Dogra emphasised the sacrifices of national leaders and the song's role in fostering patriotism. Key organisers and staff, including the NSS incharge and program officers, were present to support the event.
- The National Initiative on Tribal Week was commemorated by presenting a documentary on Birsa Munda in honour of his 151st birth anniversary on November 14, 2025.
- A seven-day NSS camp themed 'Youth for Digital Literacy & Skill Development' was held from January 08-14, 2026, with 200 volunteers participating. Participants were divided into seven groups, each led by an experienced senior student volunteer, to manage daily activities and enhance team spirit. The camp included lectures, workshops, field surveys, and cleanliness drives. Activities began with a yoga session, followed by lectures on digital-era behaviour and positive social media use, a meditation session focused on stress relief, and talks on environmental consciousness.

The aim was to equip students with managerial skills and promote mental well-being and team coordination.

- A lecture on 'Financial Literacy' was organised on January 28, 2026. Dr Vikram Khanna from Chandigarh University spoke during the session to educate students on money management, saving, budgeting and responsible spending, fostering financial awareness for a secure future. Dr Khanna covered essential topics like saving habits, banking services, digital payments, and the risks of overspending. The interactive format included discussions, real-life examples and Q&A activities, making the concepts accessible to students. Engaging charts and practical tips further enriched the lecture. Principal Dr Nisha Aggarwal praised the initiative, encouraging students to apply their financial knowledge daily. Everyone expressed gratitude for the insightful session, which concluded with a commitment to practising responsible financial habits.



- The NSS unit and the Traffic Awareness & Road Safety Society of the college organised a Road Safety Awareness Programme under Suzuki Motorcycle India's CSR initiative, Joy of Safety, in collaboration with the Value Life Foundation on February 10, 2026. The event emphasised the importance of traffic rules, defensive riding, and helmet use, with practical demonstrations and activities, including slow-ride competitions. Students received road safety resources and engaged in discussions, with participation from the college's principal and Chandigarh Traffic Police. The programme aimed to promote responsible road use and concluded with the message "Ride Smart, Ride Safe."



- On March 16, 2026 the NSS Unit of Post Graduate Government College, Sector 46, Chandigarh, organized an enlightening lecture on Project Kartavya Mission – Donation Awareness for NSS volunteers. The initiative aimed to educate students on the critical role of voluntary donation in saving lives. Mr. Vikas, the founder of Project Kartavya, delivered the lecture, emphasizing the societal importance of donation. He articulated how this noble act can assist patients during emergencies, surgeries, and the treatment of severe illnesses. Throughout the session, Mr. Vikas dispelled common myths and fears associated with donation, urging NSS volunteers to actively participate and inspire others to contribute. He also outlined the basic eligibility criteria and safety protocols involved in the donation process. The college's Principal, Prof. Nisha Aggarwal, along with NSS program officers Dr. Manisha Gaur and Dr. Kulvinder Singh, commended Mr. Vikas for his efforts. They underscored the value of such awareness programs in fostering a sense of social responsibility among the youth, encouraging them to engage in future donation drives.

- A PowerPoint-making workshop was organized by the **Department of English** for the BA II students of Ability Enhancement Course on September 12, 2025, with a unique and inspiring twist. The resource persons were none other than students of BCA II. Arshpreet and Tanvi took the lead in conducting the session, providing hands-on training and guidance to their peers. Their initiative and peer-led approach made the session engaging by cultivating a spirit of collaboration and learning among students.
- The **Department of Philosophy**, in association with the Department of Political Science, organised a lecture on "Career Opportunities in India" on September 17, 2025 to commemorate the birth anniversary of eminent Indian Philosopher Prof. Daya Krishna. Mr Kanwaljeet, research scholar, Department of Philosophy, Panjab University, Chandigarh, was the speaker. He discussed the nature of philosophy and the dimensions that have emerged in recent times, in the form of various branches of philosophy. He also discussed the career opportunities in philosophy across academia, science, social and political research, and the public domain.



- The **Department of Public Administration** observed Vigilance Awareness Week 2025 by organising a series of events, starting with a pledge on October 27, 2025 to promote probity, integrity and transparency in public life. The pledge was administered by Principal Prof. (Dr.) Beenu Dogra. The event saw enthusiastic participation from 37 teaching and non-teaching staff and 50 students. As part of the week-long observance, the Department also organised a speech competition, poster-making, and slogan-writing activities to raise students' awareness of the causes and consequences of corruption and the vital role of the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) in promoting integrity and ethical conduct in public life. The competition saw a range of innovative and informative videos, demonstrating students' understanding of AI and its applications.
- A One-Day National Seminar on "Indian Wisdom on Neeti and Nyaya (Ethics and Justice)" was successfully organised by the **Department of Philosophy** in collaboration with the Department of Political Science and the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC), on January 30, 2026. The seminar was sponsored by the Indian Council of Philosophical Research (ICPR), New Delhi, and held at the college to mark World Philosophy Day. The inaugural session was presided over by Prof. R. C. Sinha, National Fellow at the Indian Institute of Advanced Study, Rashtrapati Nivas, Shimla. Professor Shivani Sharma of the Department of Philosophy at Panjab University, Chandigarh, delivered the keynote address, offering insights into the relevance of Indian philosophical traditions to contemporary ethics and justice. Additionally, she highlighted how ancient Indian texts, including the Vedas, the Bhagavad Gita, and the Mahabharata, provide valuable frameworks for conflict resolution and social harmony. Several eminent scholars from various disciplines enriched the seminar with their insights. The resource persons included Prof. Ashutosh Kumar (Department of Political Science, Panjab University), Prof. R. K. Deswal (Kurukshetra University), Dr. Ashutosh Angiras (Former Associate Professor, Department of Sanskrit), Mr. Lallan Singh Baghel (Department of Philosophy, Panjab University), Dr. Mona Arora (Department of Sociology, GGSDS College, Chandigarh), and Dr. Ambuj Sharma (Department of Philosophy, PGGCG-11, Chandigarh). Their presentations highlighted the ethical dimensions of Neeti and Nyaya from philosophical, political, sociological and cultural perspectives. The seminar saw active participation from faculty members, research scholars, and students, resulting in meaningful discussions and academic exchange. The event successfully achieved its objective of promoting philosophical inquiry into Indian ethical traditions and their relevance in addressing contemporary issues of justice.



- The Department of Fine Arts and the Best out of Waste Society, in collaboration with Pidilite Industries Ltd., organised a three-day “Skill Enhancement through Best out of Waste” series from February 5–7, 2026, featuring workshops on fabric painting, coaster painting, and upcycling discarded materials. Guided by artist Ms Ruby, approximately 150 BA students learned techniques in design, colour application, surface preparation, and preservation while creating personalised apparel, lifestyle accessories, and eco-friendly décor. The initiative fostered creativity, confidence and entrepreneurial spirit, highlighting the college’s commitment to sustainable art practices and skill development.



- During the event "Karigiri sey Karobari," BCA students Tanvi (5554/24), Arshdeep Kaur (5519/24), and Akanksha (5504/24) demonstrated their entrepreneurial skills by setting up a stall featuring various games, including Stack A to Z, the Buzzwire game and Pick the Coin, on February 14, 2026.



- On February 18, 2026, the IT Fest "DigiTrade" took place at Post Graduate Government College Sector 46 Chandigarh, focusing on promoting technological awareness, innovation, and collaboration among students. The event attracted students from various colleges, providing them a platform to showcase their skills, creativity, and knowledge in information technology and business. A total of 48 students, accompanied by faculty members, participated in the visit to gain practical knowledge of the region's physical and human geography. Situated in the Shivalik foothills at an

elevation of 1,800–2,000 metres, the valley experiences a pleasant climate and is known as the “Peach Bowl of Asia” due to its extensive peach orchards, which contribute significantly to the local economy. The area is also characterized by dense coniferous forests and drainage by the Giri River. Students observed traditional slate-roofed houses and terraced farming, reflecting adaptation to the hilly terrain. The visit was highly informative and enhanced students’ understanding through real-world observation.



- The Department of Fine Arts organized successfully organized its Annual Art Exhibition within the Fine Arts Department premises on April 07, 2026. The exhibition was inaugurated by Dr. Anita Rani Khosla, Principal of the college. Dr. O.P. Dr. Sugandha Mittal delivered a special address, emphasising the importance of awareness about the Act and the need to sensitise students regarding their rights and responsibilities. The interactive session encouraged students to engage in discussions on complaint procedures, workplace safety, and gender equity. The session was attended by over 40 students and concluded with a collective reaffirmation of the college's commitment to fostering gender sensitivity, awareness and empowerment.

encouraged to take a pledge to combat substance abuse and promote a drug-free India by visiting <https://nmba.dosje.gov.in>.

- On September 29, 2025, a tutorial session centred on the "Say No to Drugs" initiative was held, during which students signed an undertaking.

- A seminar on “Employability through Healthcare Training” was organized for final year students by the Tech Mahindra Foundation, Chandigarh, on October 14, 2025. The session focused on how non-medical students can secure jobs in the medical healthcare industry.
- A Job Fest was organized on October 11, 2025. The Job Fest was exclusively open to students who had passed out between 2022 and 2025 from all streams, within the age group of 22 to 28 years. The initiative served as an excellent platform to connect graduates with reputed organizations in the banking and insurance sectors. Several well-known companies participated in the recruitment drive, including HDFC Bank, Axis Bank, SBI Insurance, TATA AIG and Universal Sompo. These organizations offered regular and full-time job opportunities, with posting locations provided as per the candidates’ preferences, as far as possible. A large number of eligible candidates attended the event with enthusiasm. Participants were required to bring essential documents such as updated resumes, Aadhaar card, PAN card and academic mark sheets for verification. The recruitment process was conducted smoothly, and candidates were given the opportunity to interact directly with company

representatives and clarify their queries. The event was well-organized, with prior mandatory online registration ensuring systematic participation. The presence of parents and guardians added to the transparency and credibility of the recruitment process. Overall, the Job Fest proved to be a highly beneficial initiative, offering valuable career opportunities and guidance to the students. It reflected the college's commitment to enhancing employability and supporting the professional growth of its alumni.

- A Pre-Placement Drive of ICICI Bank was organized on February 03, 2026, to provide promising career opportunities to students and alumni. The drive offered an attractive pay package of ₹5 lakh per annum, generating significant interest among eligible candidates. - In collaboration with the Gender Equity Society, an awareness session on the POSH Act and SHE-Box was conducted on September 8, 2025.
